## **Four Boone Residents Seek At-large Council Seat in March 21 Special Election**

Four Boone residents have submitted nomination papers to place their names on the ballot for the Tuesday, March 21, special election to fill an unexpired vacant at-large term on the city council.

Those seeking office are Kyle Angstrom, Robert Lay, Patrick Shaw and Deann Wood-Kluss.

In-person absentee voting begins tomorrow at the Boone County Courthouse, 201 State St. It is also the first day that absentee ballots can be mailed to the county auditor's office.

Boone County Auditor and Commissioner of Elections Diane Patrick said two voting centers will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on election Day. They are at the Boone County Fairgrounds, 1601 Industrial Road, and the courthouse.

Next Monday, March 6, is the deadline for voters to request the auditor to send an absentee ballot by mail. Requests must be received by 5:00 p.m. that day. Health-care facility residents may begin voting on Tuesday, March 7, until 5:00 p.m. on election day.

Friday, March 17, is the deadline for absentee ballots to be received in order to have their affidavit envelopes reviewed by 5:00 p.m. The auditor's office will remain open until 5:00 p.m. that day. Absentee voters have until 5:00 p.m. Monday, March 20, to correct any affidavit defects and ensure ballot affidavits are complete. Absentee ballots must be received in the auditor's office by 8:00 p.m. on election day.

A post-election audit will be conducted at 10:00 a.m. Friday, March 24. Any provisional voters must provide proof of identity/residence to the auditor's office by noon, March 27, for their ballot to be cured. The Boone County Board of Supervisors will conduct a canvass of the votes at 10:00 a.m., Tuesday March 28. The deadline for a recount request is 5:00 p.m., Friday, March 31.
